# REPORT FROM GARETH JONES COUNTY COUNCILLOR FOR LLANFAIR CAEREINION AND LLANERFYL

#### **LEISURE REVIEW**

Many thanks to everyone who completed the Leisure Review survey, it was the largest response Powys have ever had proving the importance of our Centres to our communities. Work is now under way to determine a strong leisure service throughout Powys.

#### **NEW HEALTH CENTRE**

Unfortunately, there has been no progress on the proposed new Health Centre since my last report.

I recently had a meeting with Craig Williams MP, Russell George and a representative from Caereinion Medical Centre. We are urging the developers to move at pace with the much-needed development.

#### **MOUNT ROAD**

Welshpool depot have given me assurance that Mount Road will be resurfaced late October. Residents will be notified when the works are due to commence.

#### APPOINTMENT OF CHIEF EXECUTIVE

A meeting of the full council was held on 3 October to appoint a new Chief Executive. The successful candidate was Mrs Emma Palmer. Emma has worked in Powys County Council since 1999 and has a very broad knowledge of all the service sectors within the authority.

#### **YSGOL BRO CAEREINION**

As many of you are aware Powys have announced their intention to move Ysgol Bro Caereinion into an all-Welsh School. Their proposal is to start with reception and year 7 in 2025.

Whilst this will be welcomed by many within the community, several have contacted me raising their concerns.

The transition period, the current proposal does not take into consideration learners currently in the primary phases both in Caereinion and feeder schools, a longer transition period in the secondary phase is essential.

The transport policy is also causing concern, currently the policy does not allow free transport to an English school of your choice, this is unacceptable.

I will do everything I can to represent your views, can I urge you ALL to raise your concerns via the link below. The consultation period starts on the 19<sup>th of</sup> October and runs for 6 weeks concluding on 30<sup>th</sup> of November.

#### **PYLONS**

Yet again we are being asked in our communities to accept pylons going straight through the heart of Llanerfyl and Llanfair Caereinion, they appear to be proposing going underground from Llangyniew to Llansantffraid! why can it not be all underground? if they can do it on part of the proposed Vrynwy to Hampton line they can do it on all.

What also concerns me is the proposed 132 line is nowhere near big enough to cope with the proposed wind farms in our area, is this the first of many?

The consultation closed on the 18<sup>th</sup> of October Green Gencommented.

From the conversations we've had at the events, alongside the feedback we've received, it is clear that people want us to carefully consider the visual impacts of the pylons and the potential effects on communities.

We will continue to work with local people and organisations to try and reduce impacts as much as possible.

We will be holding a second, statutory consultation in 2024.

While our consultation has now closed, our enquiry lines remain open so please get in touch with the us if you have any questions.

#### **POWYS CENSUS 2021**

Powys recently published the findings of the 2021 census, below is a summary,

Population of Powys 133,174

0-4 down 9% since 2011, 15-64 down 5.9% and 65+ up 22.7% UK Armed Forces – 5.1% of population have served in Armed Forces which is 4.5& higher than Welsh average.

Health – 79% are in very good or good health = up 0.1% since 2011.

Disability - 20.2% of population are registered disabled = down 1.1% since 2011

Unpaid Carer – 10.6% of population provide unpaid care = down 1.7% since 2011

Welsh Language – 16% of population age 3+ speak Welsh = down 2% since 2011

Education – 81.1% of population 16+ have a qualification = up 5.8% since 2011

Labour market – 57% of population 16+ are economically active = down 4.6& since 2011

Housing – 60,176 households in Powys = up 3.04% since 2011.

#### NATIONAL PARK FOR NORTH EAST WALES

In its Programme for Government (2021-2026), Welsh Government sets out its intention to designate a new National Park in North East Wales based on the existing Clwydian Range and Dee Valley Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). This would be a fourth National Park for Wales, and the first new such park to be established in Wales since 1957!

As a result, Welsh Government has commissioned Natural Resources Wales (NRW) to evaluate the case for the designation. We (NRW) are the Welsh Government's statutory adviser on landscape and natural beauty and the designating authority for any new National Parks and Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONBs).

The most southerly area of the new national park includes land within the Llanfair Town Council ward.

#### **Air Ambulance and Welshpool**



#### Have your Final Say to Save the Wales Air Ambulance base at Welshpool by Russell George MS and Craig Williams MP

Earlier this month (October), the final phase of a consultation considering potential changes to Wales Air Ambulance base locations opened. The engagement and consultation process are being led by Stephen Harrhy, the Chief Ambulance Service Commissioner for Wales who will make a recommendation to the Emergency Ambulance Services Committee that will then make a final decision, which will include the future of the Mid Wales's Air Ambulance base at Welshpool.

This is the final opportunity to give your views before the decision is made in December. We believe the Welshpool base should remain open for the long-term.

From the start of this process, our main concern has been that closing Welshpool and Caernarfon's bases would lead to a poorer service for Mid Wales.

This has now been demonstrated by modelling data from Optima, a company commissioned as part of the process to examine the potential impacts of any change. Their work has clearly found that merging bases into one North East Wales site would lead to slower overall response times in Mid Wales.

This article is about the serious concerns we still have and why we believe strongly that Welshpool's base should remain open to avoid a downgrade in services in Mid Wales.

- The modelling shows that the benefit of closing Welshpool & Caernarfon's bases and opening one new site in North West Wales would lead to just three additional missions per year. This is very clearly within a margin of error. Following the plans that were originally leaked, we were informed an extra 583 missions per year across the whole of Wales would be achieved a claim that has now been discredited. The company that provided the modelling have stated that they consider retaining both bases (Welshpool & Caernarfon) as a good option.
- At the start of this final consultation phase, it was stated that any
  impact from changes would be "tiny". If this is the case, we would
  question the need for existing bases to close which would lead to
  continued local concern.
- If only one base is operated from to cover the Mid and North Wales area, poor weather could mean both air ambulances located at this one base are grounded.
  - Currently, separate bases give added protection if one base is hit by poor weather or other events.
- It has previously been stated that the need for change is about patient outcomes, not economics. During the final consultation, it now appears that economics is a factor in the final recommendation. We

have concerns that closing Welshpool and Caernarfon's bases will also impact the charity's ability to fundraise.

The questionnaire completed in the initial consultation may not have captured all relevant views. For example, it asked people to think if all of Wales should have an equal service which is clearly is likely to be answered positively. This may be used to make the case for the reconfiguration on bases. An equal service across Wales does not mean the same service delivered in every place. Many rural areas like ours do not have a local district general hospital, or reasonable access to A&E facilities, which strengthens the case for a locally based Air Ambulance services.

It is clear that closing Welshpool and Caernarfon's bases and to open a new base in North Wales at Rhuddlan is still a very serious threat. It is now critically important that we have one last big push to feed our views into the final consultation.

We attended public meetings in Welshpool and Newtown on October 12th and 13th respectively, and many thanks to those who attended these meetings as well as the public meeting in Machynlleth.

#### USING THE MAIN LINE RAIL SERVICE

**North & Mid Wales Association of Local Councils** 

#### Press release on rail transport in North and Mid Wales







I am sure you will all have stories to tell about your journeys over the past few years along the North Coast, Chester to Shrewsbury and Cambrian lines (Aberystwyth via Shrewsbury to Birmingham). Well new trains are due to be in service all over Wales soon, indeed some have already arrived

The Association has a dedicated committee to get involved with the main line and has completed an extensive survey into train use, safety, customer satisfaction and many other matters.

A report seeking better rail services has been completed and has been presented to Welsh Government and TFW. To see the report on the Cambrian and North Wales Coast lines please following the link here: <a href="https://northwalesassociation.org.uk">https://northwalesassociation.org.uk</a> and look under documents.

The report is now available and has been submitted to Welsh Government, Transport for Wales, and the Health & Safety Executive. The reason for the surveys were a deep concern regarding overcrowding, particularly on long journeys. The new trains have less seats than the current ones in use and are of 'commuter train' design. In the view of the Association these trains are not for long distance journeys.

During the survey there were several experiences observed:

- i) A family with young children having sit on their cases in the toilet as there was no other space available.
- ii) A mother sitting on the floor with a young baby due to lack of space.
- iii) More people on the train then seats available with passengers standing for periods of more than an hour.
- iv) Trains running late on a regular basis causing stress to those needing connections.

In the view of the Association the new trains do not meet what is needed. The Association are of the view that overcrowding on a good number of trains is so bad it is unsafe, bordering on dangerous.

There are three reasons for this statement:

- i) People who have disabilities cannot get to the toilets.
- ii) People who go ill will have no space to recover.
- iii) The guard cannot get to any person who is distressed or unwell needing help.
- iv) If the train pulls up sharply or hits something the injury level would be unacceptable.






