Llanfair Caereinion Town Council is 50 years old

First a bit of history

Until 1974 Wales was divided into civil parishes. These were abolished by the Local Government Act 1972, and replaced by Town and Community Councils. Llanfair Caereinion Town Council was born on 1st April 1974.

The principal areas of Wales are divided entirely into communities. Unlike in England, where unparished areas still exist, no part of Wales is outside a community, even in urban areas. However, not every community has a council

Community councils in Wales are identical to English parish councils in terms of their powers and the way they operate. The council has few 'duties' (things it must do) but has extensive powers (enabling it to do things).

Welsh community councils may call themselves Town Councils if they meet the criteria and may have city status granted by the Crown. In Wales, all town councils are community councils.

There are currently three community councils with city status: Bangor, St Asaph and St David's. The community of Caernarfon has the status of a Royal Town.


The chair of a town council or city council will usually have the title mayor.

One Voice Wales was established in 2004 and is the main organisation for community and town councils in Wales. The association represents the interests of councils across Wales and offers a range of other support services. One Voice Wales is also a portal for advice on how to set up a new council or to become a councillor. There also other representative organisations such as Local Government Association, North & Mid Wales Association of Local Councils and the Society of Local Council Clerks.

Elections are held every five years under the first-past-the-post voting system. Currently in 2024 eleven councillors were elected and one co-opted. This is good as many local councils do not have all their council seats occupied.

There are 735 community and town councils and 8,000 councillors in Wales, covering approximately 94% of the land area and 70% of the population of Wales.^[10]

REPORT FROM GARETH JONES

COUNCILLOR
FOR LLANFAIR CAEREINION AND LLANERFYL

SINGLE TRANSFERABLE VOTE (STV)

Council has voted to go out to consultation on moving to STV.. What is STV

- STV is a multi-winner electoral system in which each voter casts a single vote in the form of a ranked based ballot.
- A move from 52 single member wards and 8 multi member wards .to all multi member wards.
- There would remain 68 Councillors within Powys
- Voters can rank as many or as few candidates as they wish or can vote for only one candidate.

Several of you have contacted me with opinions on this and I again would welcome further views.

REPLACEMENT LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN - 2026 ONWARDS

I recently attended a workshop on the replacement LDP. It will take into consideration – population projections, local housing market assessments including the type and location of property needs, housing land supply, completion rates and the economic growth and employment development.

YSGOL BRO CAEREINION

At a cabinet meeting held on 19/03/2024 Cabinet unanimously voted to approve the recommendation to change the language categorisation of Ysgol Bro Caereinion.

In the new summer term, there will be a 28-day statutory notice period. Following the consultation there are two changes to the original proposal.

The proposal relating to transport has been amended to provide transport for year four learners and below.

The transition for year seven intake has been delayed by one year, from 2025 to 2026.

I have raised concerns about the lack of communication throughout this transformation process, and the lack of detail surrounding bespoke financial support.

RATE RELIF 2024/2025

Welsh Government is to fund a Retail Leisure & Hospitality rates relief scheme for the financial year 2024/25.

Powys businesses operating in these sectors can apply for the **40%** discount off their Business Rates bill for 2024/25.

Funding of up to £3.2m is available and it is expected that 980 Powys businesses will qualify.

RURAL POLICING UPDATE

The police spoke about rural crime and in particular farm theft. They are very keen to come out into the rural communities to talk to various groups i.e. Community Councils, W.I, YFC, Agricultural Groups. If you wish to have a meeting regarding Crime Prevention Advice, please do get in touch.

COUNTY FARMS BRIEFING

The Powys County Farms Estate comprises of 8 starter farms (less than 10 acres), 85 intermediate farms (10 – 89 acres) and 42 progression farms (more than 90 acres). The estate is currently being re-valued but in 2018/19 it was valued at £95.3m.

BUDGET SETTING 24/25

The budget for the coming financial year was agreed on 22.02. 2024. Regretably the Council Tax has been set at 7.5% for the next 12 months. I along with 32 other Cllrs voted against with 34 Cllrs voting for.

POWYS SUSTAINABLE FOCUS BRIEFING

I recently attended in Llanfair a sustainable Powys briefing meeting. There are currently local briefings taking place in the 13 larger towns in Powys to engage with members, schools, Town and Community Councils including joint working between Powys County Council, Powys Teaching Health Board, PAVO and Llais. The areas of engagement will be Climate & Nature, Education, Housing, Income & Work, Council & Democracy, Your Community, Infrastructure & Transport and Wellbeing. It was disappointing how few from within our community had been invited to attend.

ELECTIONS AND GOVERNANCE – WELSH GOVERNMENT About the Bill

The Bill aims to create a modern Senedd, better able to represent people in Wales, with increased capacity to scrutinise, make laws, and hold the government to account. It also realises the recommendations made by the Special Purpose Committee on Senedd Reform, which were endorsed by a majority of Senedd Members in June 2022.

If Senedd Members support the changes outlined in the Bill, they will be in place for the 2026 Senedd elections.

The Senedd Reform Bill proposes the following changes:

- The Senedd will have 96 Members elected using closed proportional lists. The seats would be allocated to parties using the D'Hondt formula.
- The 32 new UK Parliament constituencies will be paired to create 16 Senedd constituencies for the 2026 Senedd election. Each constituency will elect six Members.
- Senedd elections will be held every four years from 2026 onwards.

- An increase in the maximum number of Welsh Ministers which can be appointed from 12 to 17 (plus the First Minister and the Counsel General) with an additional power to enable a further increase in the number to 18 or 19 with the approval of the Senedd.
- Increase the maximum number of Deputy Presiding Officers who can be elected by Senedd Members from one to two.
- All candidates for future Senedd elections must live in Wales.
- A pathway for further consideration in the Seventh Senedd of the practical and legislative implications of job-sharing of offices relating to the Senedd
- A review mechanism to consider the operation and effect of the new legislative provisions following the 2026 election and any other Senedd reform issue it considers relevant.

The Bill also proposes a full boundary review should take place after the 2026 Senedd election. This will take effect at the 2030 Senedd election, with reviews every eight years. The Local Democracy and Boundary Commission for Wales will be repurposed and renamed – to be known as the Democracy and Boundary Commission Cymru with the functions necessary to undertake reviews of Senedd constituency boundaries.

A separate Bill to introduce gender quotas for candidates for election to the Senedd, with the aim of making the institution more effective and more representative of the people it serves, will be brought forward later in the year.

Estimated cost of the changes is £18m per annum.
