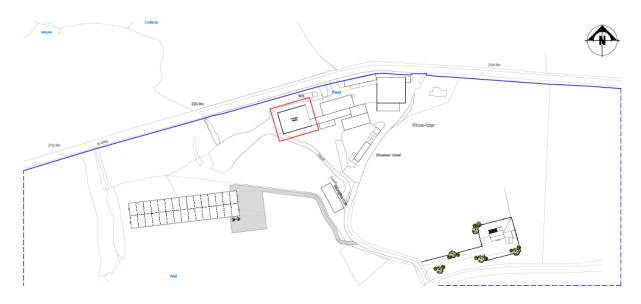

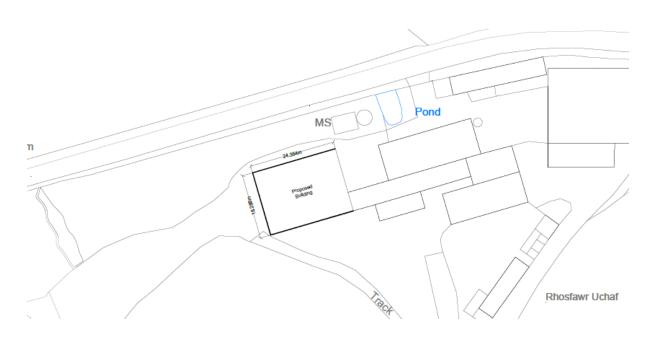

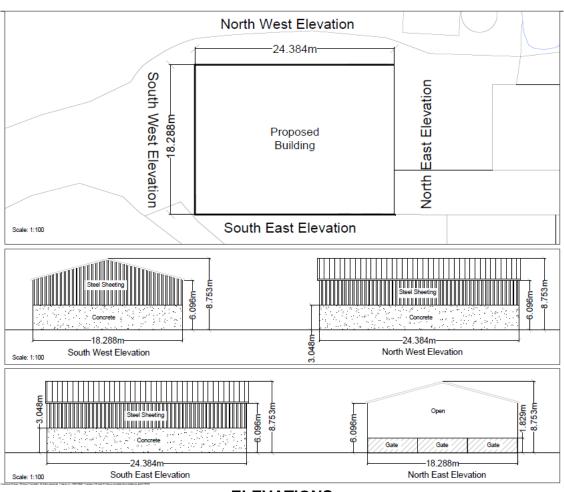
LOCATION PLAN

APPENDIX G

1. Introduction

On occasions there are Welsh Government proposals and consultations which are relevant to a Town and Community Council. Below are set out some changes in Planning Legislation proposed and of which the Council should be aware.

2. Changes in Permitted Development Rights

There are plans to change the Permitted Development Rights (those things you can do without the need for a planning consent). Some changes are temporary changes to allow development or change of use for a period of time thus giving applicants a chance to try out new things before having to apply for consent to make it permanent. Others will remain permanent. Examples of such changes include:

- a) Changing the use of a shop to a hot food outlet or a professional use without consent or visa-versa.
- b) Extending temporary use of land from 14 days to 28-56 days per annum without consent.
- c) Houses in multiple occupation to have an permitted development rights removed.
- d) Installation of electric charging points without the need for a planning consent in many cases.

There are other changes but those listed are the most relevant to this Council.

3. Changes in the Use Class Order (Planning Acts)

The issue of housing shortages are causing great concern. The effect of a housing shortage is house price increases making affordability an issue and a cost to the Local Authority in providing for homeless in emergency accommodation among others.

To this end the Welsh Government is proposing to change the Use Class order to control second homes and holiday homes. The following chart sets out the new Use Class Order for residential property.
