









PROPOSED BLOCK PLAN

APPENDIX E

(From My Welshpool)

Controversial plans to move the all-age Ysgol Bro Caereinion in Llanfair Caereinion along the language continuum so it eventually becomes a Welsh-medium school could take a step closer if a recommendation to Cabinet is approved, the county council has said.

Powys County Council is proposing to move the school along the language continuum from a dual-stream school to a Welsh-medium school on a phased basis, but is has faced considerable local opposition.

The move would enable all learners to develop their language skills and become fluent in Welsh and English, ensuring that they become fully bilingual, and able to confidently use both languages in the future.

The council said it would also ensure that pupils in this part of Powys could access designated Welsh-medium secondary provision which is already available to pupils in other parts of Wales, but currently unavailable in Powys.

The council carried out a seven-week consultation between October and December 2023 and the findings of the consultation report will be considered by Cabinet next Tuesday.

The recommendation being considered by Cabinet is that the council should proceed with the proposal to change Ysgol Bro Caereinion's language category by publishing a Statutory Notice.

However, following concerns raised during the consultation about the proposed implementation in the secondary phase, it is being recommended that an amendment is made to the date that the secondary transition will start – from September 2025 to September 2026. The transition in the primary phase is still being recommended to being in September 2025.

To further address the concerns about impact on pupils currently accessing Englishmedium primary provision in the area, it is being recommended to Cabinet that, as a temporary measure, to offer free home-to-school transport to pupils currently in years 4 and below at Ysgol Bro Caereinion and Ysgol Rhiw Bechan to their nearest English-medium secondary provider when they transfer from primary to secondary.

Additional support would be provided to pupils not yet in the Welsh stream in the form of immersive Welsh language support 'Trochi', to enable pupils currently in the English stream in the school's primary phase to transfer to Welsh-medium provision.

This type of provision has previously been delivered in the county and in other authorities to enable pupils to transfer from English-medium education to Welsh-medium education.

Cllr Pete Roberts, Cabinet Member for a Learning Powys, said: "We would like to thank all those who took part in the consultation exercise for this proposal. After considering all the consultation responses, the recommendation that will be put forward to Cabinet is to continue with the proposal by publishing the statutory notice formally proposing the change.

"We have considered the consultations findings and have amended the proposal to address some of the concerns that have been raised.

"This proposal would see the council provide well planned provision for increasing the opportunities for a growing number of children and young people to become fully bilingual, fluent in both Welsh and English and therefore contributing to the Welsh Government's aspiration to achieve a million Welsh speakers by 2050.

"This proposal meets the aims of the Strategy for Transforming Education in Powys and implement the commitments in our Welsh in Education Strategic Plan, which will enable us to make good progress against our target of increasing the number of pupils being taught through the medium of Welsh."

Hello Robert,

Firstly please accept my apologies for the delay in responding, my team is small and very busy as you can imagine!

Secondly, thank you for your email and summary of meeting discussions, this is useful and reflects other discussions to date.

I would like to clarify that we have only undertaken an engagement period so far, as we have been (and still are) gathering a detailed understanding of the many and varied issues that need to be considered.

It may be reassuring for me to tell you that we have already captured all of the issues mentioned in your email and some others.

We are also undertaking a number of detailed assessments and impact studies at present and meeting regularly with the Local Authorities affected.

A summary of the findings will be made available ahead of the actual consultation, which will take place in the Autumn & winter of 2024.

There is currently no finalised proposal to either support or object to.

When the assessment work is complete, we will prepare a proposed boundary map and other evidence for consultation.

We will then review the consultation responses and may make further amendments in 2025 ahead of presenting our recommendations to Welsh Government for a decision.

The assessment is evidence based rather than political, so it will continue irrespective of support or objection. Ministers will be made aware of stakeholder feelings along with the evidence in order to inform their final decision (likely in early 2026)

Prior to that point there will be a package of evidence and suggestions to inform and address many of the issues that were mentioned in your meeting.

The web page bellow will be updated in early April with a summary report of the engagement findings, key themes and our initial response.

It will also carry details of the consultation and I will ensure that you receive an email update.

I hope your council will therefore take up the ample opportunities to participate in the consultation make any final decision of its feelings at the appropriate stage.

PRINTED FROM MY WELSHPOOL 13th March 2024

The people of Mid Wales are set to be betrayed by a charity they have taken to their hearts and raised millions of pounds for over many years.

Recommendations, shared with us by lead opposition campaigner Cllr Elwyn Vaughan and included in the engagement process over the past year's final report, are giving the green light to close the Welshpool and Caernarfon bases in favour of one new base in North East Wales.

"Despite claims to be listening, they have ignored the reality on the ground and is a disgrace how the whole thing has been handled," fumed Cllr Vaughan.

The recommendations come at the end of what the report calls "the culmination of an extensive review of the Emergency Medical Retrieval and Transfer Service (EMRTS)".

Scant consolation for Montgomeryshire is a recommendation that a new operational base is created that provides alternative road cover.

The report is likely to be rubber stamped by the bosses of each Welsh regional Health Board at a March 19 meeting.

So, what is likely to happen? These are the four recommendations:

Recommendation 1: The Committee approves the consolidation of the Emergency Medical Retrieval and Transfer Services currently operating at Welshpool and Caernarfon bases into a single site in North Wales.

Recommendation 2: The Committee requests that the Charity secures an appropriately located operational base in line with the findings of this Report.

Recommendation 3: The Committee requires that a joint plan is developed by EMRTS and the Charity, that maintains service provision across Wales during the transition to a new base and that this plan is included within the Committee's commissioning arrangements.

Recommendation 4: The Committee approves the development of a commissioning proposal for bespoke road-based enhanced and/or critical care services in rural and remote areas. The charity can expect a fierce backlash from angry local residents with many already vowing to stop their monthly direct debits.

The charity said the operations review has never been about cost cutting, but the data provided by the specialists to back up their case has been questioned at every point, and accused of being flawed by campaigners.
