

Descriptive Gazetteer Entry for LLANFAIR-CAEREINION

LLANFAIR-CAEREINION, a small town and a parish in Llanfyllin district, Montgomery. The town stands on the river Einion, 8¼ miles WSW of Welshpool Raven Square Station, and 11 NW of Montgomery; takes the latter part of its name from the ancient British camp of Castell-Caereinion, about 3 miles to the E; is neatly built and picturesquely situated; forms a good centre for anglers in the Banwy, the Einion, and the Vyrnwy; is a seat of petty sessions and a polling-place; and has a post office, under Welshpool, two good inns, a town hall, a church, five dissenting chapels, and charities £6.

The church is early English, contains the effigies of a knight, and was about to be restored in the early part of 1867.

A weekly market is held on Saturday; and fairs are held on Shrove-Tuesday, the Saturday before Palm-Sunday, 18 May, 26 July, 3 Oct., 1 Nov., and the Friday before Christmas 'The parish contains the townships of Brynelen, Brynglas, Dolgead, Gelligasson, Gwaenynog, Heniarth, Kylyruclh Llanlodian-Isaf, Llanlodian-Uchaf, Penarth, Pentyrch, Rhewhirieth, and Rhosaflo. Acres, 16,157.

Rated property, £10,052. Pop. in 1851, 2,727; in 1861, 2,584. Houses, 543. The property is subdivided. The surface is undulating, and rises toward the S into small hills.

A Roman way traversed the parish; and numerous Roman coins and other relics were found in 1740.

There are two woollen factories. The living is a vicarage in the diocese of St. Asaph. Value, £358. * Patron, the Bishop of St. Asaph.

TOWN REFURB



The town will have seen a start on refurbishment of all the finger posts, railings, bollards and seating around the town. This was funded as part of the Town Trail grant. The High School and local volunteers are also playing their part by keeping the town tidy.

TOWN TRAIL





The Council has gained a grant to help refurbish the playground facilities. An overall plan for play provision in the Town has been prepared to seek improvements to the provision. The youngsters will be involved in the design of any new play facilities.

The containers for storage at Mount Field have been painted and works to tidy up the trees and ditches is taking place very soon. New litter bins have been installed to help keep the area tidy for everyone.

COVID: 91% of adults aged 18+ in Powys have received their first dose, and 87% have received their second dose. In my recent meeting with Powys Health Board, the CEO informed me that Powys has a particularly high take up rate in the 16 and 17 years old age group which is good news, especially given the rurality of the county. If you are aged 16+ and registered with a Powys GP and have not yet received your first dose then you can attend drop-in sessions or use the Priority Access Forms to let the health board know. Please do not contact your GP about first dose appointments, as all remaining first dose appointments are being organised via the health board.

Ambulance Response Times: Over the last few months, I have been contacted by a number of constituents raising concerns over the time for an ambulance to arrive with a patient. In the last few weeks,

The Wales Ambulance Service has agreed to meet with me and Craig Williams MP but in the interim, they recognise and accept that the frequency and length of delays which have been experienced falls well short of the level of service which they aspire to provide for patients.

I have been informed that they are deploying a range of actions to grow capacity; defray activity to alternatives where it is safe to do so and to improve the efficiency of existing resources during a time when the service is busier than it has ever been . I'm pleased to hear that they are recruiting and training more people, growing all elements of their service and seeking to deliver a much improved experience for patients in Montgomeryshire.

What is a Town Plan?

What is in the Plan?

When completing the plan the results of the survey carried out in 2018, the Youth Council, Local Businesses and the consultation response to the final plan was considered alongside other research including the census.

How much will it all cost?

The Council will seek to keep the Local Council Tax as reasonable as possible and will seek grant aid wherever it can. Where is a significant project consultation with the residents will take place alongside the views of the Youth Council.

What is planned to happen and when



RHYS STEPHENS STEPS DOWN AS FIRST TEAM MANAGER

AFTER 10 INCREDIBLY SUCCESSFUL YEARS IN HIS SECOND SPELL AS FIRST TEAM MANAGER, RHYS HAS TAKEN THE DECISION TO STEP DOWN.

The committee and everyone involved at the club fully support Rhys' decision to step down, but he will be sorely missed and leaves a big hole to fill.

Rhys re-joined the club as manager in 2011, after previously leaving to coach at Newtown Football Club.

In 2011/12, the first team narrowly missed out on promotion to Division 1 but won the ER Jenkins Division 2 Cup. They then went on to secure promotion to Division 1 in 2012/13 and retained the ER Jenkins Cup.

In 2013/14, the club won the Central Wales Cup for the first time, with a memorable 2-0 win over Berriew. In 2014/15, the club made history, winning the Mid Wales League and promotion to the Cymru Alliance for the first time. They also lifted the Montgomeryshire Cup for the first time and held on to it for the next 3 years..

Rhys guided the first team through two tough, but exciting seasons. During the past 10 years, Rhys has played a huge part in using his role as manager to help form a ladies team, a youth team and he has created a strong link in the community, with the local high school, seeing numerous youngsters come through to play for the senior sides. Even jobs such as washing the kit after a game when needed or marking the pitch, have never been too much for Rhys during his time as manager.

Everyone at the club would like to thank Rhys for everything he has done. He leaves on incredibly good terms and we wish him all the best with his new endeavours

REPORT FROM GARETH JONES

COUNTY COUNCILLOR FOR LLANFAIR CAEREINION

All AGE SCHOOL

A temporary governing body has been formed from both governing bodies within Llanfair. I was appointed Chair with Ann Watkin Jones appointed Vice Chair. We are currently in the process of appointing a Head Teacher.

The committee members are drawing up a vision for the school. The All Age New School will open in September 2022.

TOWN ROADS

Many of you have rightly contacted me regarding the poor state of our roads within the Town, I am pleased to say that I have been given assurances that they will be resurfaced in the coming weeks, the work will be carried out in the evenings to minimise disruption. When I know the exact dates, I will inform everyone via social media.

MOUNT ROAD

Over the summer investigative work has been carried out to determine where the surface water is coming from, the highways department started to install new drains week commencing 20th September.

BITFIL

Cllr Cadfan Evans and I met with Powys highways officers to discuss options for improving the road, we were given assurances that work will be carried out in the near future to address the blocked drains, poor signage and verge subsidence , when I have further details once again I will share my information.

PLAYGROUNDS

A number of parents have contacted me regarding playground facilities within the Town. I have spoken to Powys who has stated that we are on top of their list for investment. I have also held conversations with the Town Council about where is the right location to invest in facilities for our children. If you have any opinions where you think the right location within the town would be please let me know your thoughts.

ECONOMY, RESIDENTS SCRUTINY COMMITTEE 6.9.21

A scrutiny meeting was held to review Child Poverty in Powys, 23% of the Welsh population live on incomes below the poverty line. In Llanfair Caereinion there is 25% of the population in Child Poverty and I stressed that free school meals must be promoted more. Cllr Heulwen Hulme gave a presentation on the Waste and Recycling Service as of 31 July. Our target for this year is 65% and this will be made up of kerbside collections, Household Waste Recycling Centres, Garden Waste, Trade Waste and local bring sites (cardboard skips).
